Meeting Notes:

 The committee approved the meeting minutes for the meeting on 11/24/24, and JD reminded everyone of the need to publish them on the website to comply with CSU policies.

Newsletter Updates and Lot Closure Notifications

- Silvia provided updates on the newsletter and its open rate of 70%, and the newsletter now has over 9.000 subscribers.
- Silvia discussed the new lot closure notification emails and the 80% open rate so far. Folks are now able to sign up for email notifications.

Transit Options

 Silvia discussed the employee 3-month trial transit pass pilot program, which has seen 50 people enroll since its start. Once it is launched, PATS will promote this program through the transportation liaison program, which is a volunteer position.

- Silvia provided an update on transit options for students, faculty, and staff.
 - Students can purchase discounted monthly passes for \$42 through the transportation portal, and semester passes are also available.
- PATS plans to advertise the program in the SDSU Transit Center and to share flyers. Silvia encouraged everyone to share this information with their groups.
 - Guthre mentioned promoting through the AS Union and ARC center screens as well
 - Wesley suggests advertising these options in more visible locations on campus.

Zipcar Pilot

 Silvia also introduced a new Zipcar pilot program offering a \$25 membership or driving credit to students, faculty, and staff, but notes low engagement despite high social media interactions.

• Evolve Project Parking Impacts Discussed

- JD discussed the planned parking impacts due to the Evolve project, a student housing project that will add approximately 4,600 new beds on SDSU's campus.
- JD shared that about 569 parking spaces will be lost, which is about 4% of the total capacity.

• Parking Rates and Fleet Vehicle Management

- JD also outlined that 13 rate and policy changes were approved by the President of SDSU, including a 6% increase in long-term parking fees and a shift in overnight permits to the East Side. He noted that the changes would be communicated to students through a campus-wide email and a dedicated webpage.
 - Guthre asked about the notification process, to which JD responded that a high-level message would be sent to all students, including the 6% fee increase and the overnight permit change.
- He highlighted the approval for charging up to \$50 for major events, the introduction of a new car and fleet vehicle fee for new procurements, and the need to manage the growing number of fleet vehicles.
- JD also mentioned the revamping of the procurement form to include the use of Zipcars for short-term vehicle needs.
 - Hank raised a point about the need for electric fleet vehicles, which JD acknowledged and mentioned that the University is considering this in their procurement process.

Survey Launch and Testing Feedback

 JD discussed the upcoming survey launch on March 4th, which is being funded by OES & PATS. The survey is run by Dr. Appleyard, Megan Honey, and Madison Cranford.

- The survey was shortened to under 5 minutes, and JD encouraged everyone to promote it within their departments.
 - Megan clarified that the preview links sent out were for testing purposes and wouldn't affect the results.
 - JD also asked for feedback on any typos or unclear wording in the survey.
- The group discusses potential changes to a transportation survey, including how to handle occasional or secondary modes of transportation.
- JD suggests adding an optional question for secondary or occasional modes, while Megan expresses concern about making the survey too complex.
- Guthre suggested combining bike and e-bike, and scooter and e-scooter categories in the transportation survey to avoid overwhelming respondents.
 - Megan agreed to condense these categories to improve survey completion rates.
- Hank proposed adding "drop off/pick up" to the carpool option, which could be considered as an alternative.

Parking Garage Maintenance Update

- JD provided an update on the major maintenance projects for the parking organization. The projects include an \$82,000 repair in the P14 garage and a \$4.5 million project to rebuild the P15 lot, which is expected to go out to bid soon.
- PATS has about \$10.9 million in reserves for the main campus now, which will go down to about \$7.9 million after the P15 and P14 projects are completed. JD also mentioned that PATS is spending reserves faster than they are putting them back in. He explained that this is possible in the short term, but reserves will need to be maintained for the long term, which will require rate and/or policy changes.JD offered to meet offline for any in-depth questions.

Addressing MTS Structural Deficit

- JD discussed the structural deficit projected by MTS, which was shared by MTS is a recent Community Advisory Committee meeting. The expected problem starts in fiscal year 2028, with expenses exceeding revenues by more than 100 million dollars.
 - He also mentioned potential solutions such as shifting capital funds, raising fares, and exploring new funding sources like a statewide sales tax increase.
- Additionally, he highlighted the possibility of extending State Senate Bill 125, which provides temporary funding to transit agencies. Lastly, he mentioned that MTS will conduct a comprehensive operations analysis (COA) to restructure operations in line with the new post-Covid world.
 - Ariel outlined the upcoming comprehensive operations analysis, which will involve community engagement and public forums in April and May. The analysis will gather data and sentiment from various communities, including students at SDSU, to inform decision-making. By spring next

year, the full operations analysis will be completed and presented to the public.

- Wesley requested a dialogue with MTS in the coming months to inform the next commissioner.
 - Ariel agreed to initiate outreach to partners in March, followed by public forums in April and May.
- JD shared the implementation of 15-minute service on the green line every day and the introduction of a new route operating between 12:30 and 5 AM.
 - He also reminded attendees about fare enforcement and the TDM plan.
- JD mentioned the possibility of a name change for PATS and requested feedback on future topics for future meetings.
- Silvia set the next meeting for April 17th at 11 AM.
